

For the most part, distribution is channeled through wholesale hardware firms. P & C does not operate its own retail outlets. Customers are located in every state, Canada, Mexico, Central America and overseas. The United States Government is a good customer of ours, too. P & C also produces thousands of attractive display merchandisers to help sell our tools as well as those of other divisions of our company.

THEY NAMED IT "P & C"

If you've wondered how P & C got its name, Here's a bit of history. Back in 1913, an enterprising Scandinavian toolmaker, John Peterson, operated a small garage and blacksmith shop in McCall, Idaho, where he found it necessary to make his own repair tools. Soon, other mechanics wanted to buy these quality tools. Later he was joined by Carl Carlborg — "Peterson and Carlborg" became "P & C. That's how the "P & C Hand Forged Tool Company" came into being. In 1922, the new firm moved to Milwaukie, Oregon. In 1941, P & C became a subsidiary of Pendleton Tool Industries, Los Angeles. Finally, the name was shortened in 1956 to P & C Tool Company.
